

You will need:

375g pack ready-roll puff pastry
6 tablespoons ready made pasta sauce (not too chunky)
If you want - 100g wafer thin ham
100g mature cheddar grated
1 egg - beaten

Preheat oven to Fan 180 (conventional oven 200) Gas Mk 6

1 teaspoon dried oregano or mixed herbs.

Unroll the pastry onto a lightly floured surface & roll it out to 40×32 cm Spread a layer of pasta sauce over it - leaving a 1cm border around the edges. If using ham put it evenly on the top. Scatter the grated cheese over.

Start at one of the short ends - roll the pastry up as tightly as possible. Chill in the fridge for 10 minutes.

Grown-up - take a sharp knife & cut the roll into 12 equal slices, laying them flat on 2 non-stick baking trays. Brush each pinwheel lightly with beaten egg & sprinkle over the herbs.

Bake for 12-15 minutes until puffed & golden.

Leave to stand for 5-10 minutes before serving.



SNAIL TRAIL

Remove the crusts from square slices of brown bread & flatten them using a rolling pin. Children choose a filling such as cheese spread, jam, marmite or honey - & spread it over the slice of bread.

Starting at one end, carefully roll up the bread into a sausage shape.

Slice the rolls into 2cm thick rounds.

Stand the spirals of bread on their sides, with the edge of the bread just poking out from the bottom.

Add 2 small pieces of carrot at the join to make the antennae.

Place some shredded lettuce on the plate & make a 'trail' over it with mayonnaise.

Arrange the snails around the trail.

Enjoy eating them.





















Bounce: u-u-u-u-umbrella Handwrite: Down and under, up to the top and draw the puddle

Stretch: ffffflower Handwrite: Down the stem, and draw the leaves











Bounce: e-e-e-egg Handwrite: Lift off the top and scoop out the egg




Bounce: i-i-i-insect Handwrite: Down the body, dot for the head

Bounce: t-t-t-tower Handwrite: Down the tower, across the tower


Bounce: d-d-d-d-dinosaur Handwrite: Round his bottom, up his tall neck, down to his feet

Stretch: ssssssnake Handwrite: Slither down the snake







