Our Learning Quest Understanding Trade	Fairtrade chocolate brownies: You will need – 0.25kg muscovado sugar 200g unsalted butter 0.2kg dark chocolate 3 large eggs 2 rounded tsp fairtrade espresso powder 1.5 tsp fairtrade vanilla extract 110g plain flour 1 rounded tsp baking powder 110g pecans roughly chopped (optional) Fairtrade cocoa powder to dust. What is the combined weight of the sugar, butter, chocolate, flour and pecans? What if I wanted to make twice as many brownies?	Rainforests are a great natural resource. Research what resources can be found in rainforests and create an information leaflet. Think about: Where are rainforests found? What resources can we get from rainforests? What is happening to the world's rainforests? What can we do to preserve these natural resources?	Ask your family the following questions: What are the five essential everyday items in your household? Do they all come from the United Kingdom? Why do you think some products might need to be imported from other countries? What are the benefits of trading with other countries?	Design a 'trade' board game to play with your family. Think about the different rules you want to create. Pick ten of your favourite foods from your kitchen. Have a look at where your food came from – how far has it travelled? Use the calculator to find out. https://www.food miles.com/ How could you be more environmentally friendly? If you can gain access to a printed world map you can draw the routes your food has taken.	What are the UK's top ten biggest exports? What different ways could you present this data?	Watch the video on the story of cotton. Why is buying sustainable clothing important? Research the impact that cotton farming has on the world.
