Curriculum area	Tasks
Reading	<ol> <li>Continue to use the SeeSaw app which will have a new batch of comprehensions uploaded onto it ready for you to complete.</li> <li>Some Active Reading has been placed on SeeSaw on our book 'The Children of Willesden Lane' complete as you would in class. A copy of the talking frame will be added in as an example so you can use the sentence starters.</li> <li>Read daily for at least 30 minutes. Ensure you comment in your reading record. Parent(s)/Carer(s), please comment in your child's reading record and ask them relevant questions about the book. Writing	<ol> <li>Please keep learning all the 3/4 and 5/6 spelling list.</li> <li>Write a letter to your teacher explaining what you have been up to during the period you have been away from school. What have the best bits been? What have you missed/what have the worst bits been? Upload onto SeeSaw in response to the Activity.</li> <li>Persuasive writing – what are the features of persuasive writing? Brainstorm these (think about TV adverts in particular – how do they persuade you?). Read through the example of an advert which has been posted on SeeSaw. How many of these features can you identify? Write down any examples you could use in your own writing.</li> <li>Persuasive writing – pick one fair trade product (google will provide you with lots of ideas). Think of adjectives and other descriptive language to make it sound appealing. Don't forget to use a thesaurus (if possible) to upscale your word choices.</li> <li>Create your own advert for a fair trade product. If you like, you can even film this and post it to SeeSaw to inspire others.</li> </ol>
